 - Stay steadfast


C. <u>Q&A</u>

- What if someone puts me down?
 - You are the servant of God; you cannot accept glory from people. It takes away any blessing that is given to you by God. If someone insults you, accept it and be glad because God will reward you in heaven.
 - Talk to your spiritual advisor/father confessor, perhaps you are letting your ego get in the way.
 - Ask advice from your leader in the service.
 - Communication is key there is no need to escalate if you can resolve any issues through communication.
 - Pray about the problem:
 - a. Always lift an arm: pray
 - b. Break a knee: kneel
 - c. Get your nourishment from the Gospel
- How can we encourage the youth to participate in events, especially the festival?
